Hurricane awareness and preparedness

1. What happens on campus:

The university can evacuate before the city makes a decision, or the president can wait for the city to make a decision. Usually we do it before the city because it's a lot harder to do once the city calls an evacuation

When the decision has been made to evacuate, the UNO police lockdown the campus, but they stay on campus.

There are animals on campus and essential personnel need to come check on them

Essential personnel (group 1 - safety and IT. infrastructure of the university), essential group 2 - these are predetermined lists. They aren't fluid. The list is approved by the president and is finalized in May or early June. There are only three levels, so if you don't already know you're level you are not in group 1 or 2!

2. Pointers about making decisions

If you have small children, elderly family, or have medical needs: really really consider leaving. Hopefully we don't have another Katrina situation, our levees have been hardened and developed, but we can still see issues. Last year's hurricane Ida showed us this if we have 1 or 2 weeks without power it can be VERY uncomfortable and it can be hard to get around to get supplies

Be WEATHER AWARE, and MAKE PLANS NOW.

Get your basic plans now / at the beginning of the season when everything is easily available, batteries, water, etc.

Evacuate away from the northeast quadrant of the storm - have an evacuation plan for east and west, so you can avoid the worst damage of the storm

3. Storm related policies and procedures for UNO/ City of NO, State

City of New Orleans requires 72 hours to evacuate the city in the case of a mandatory evacuation. Before this, it's a voluntary evacuation

It' takes a lot longer to evacuate if you wait too long

Unplug your computers, put them up, and keep stuff away from the windows. Empty out the fridges

If contraflow is installed - make sure to study the maps when you know where you're going so you get on the right exit going in the right direction

We use private buses, if we don't evacuate before we need to wait for the state to release the companies before we can evacuate.
